- Make it fun (energy efficiency is boring)








THE Results

- 6 million KWH Saved
- 52,000 CFLS Switched
- 900 Energy Saving Power Strips
 - 400 Weatherization Kits
- 200 Energy Star Appliances Rebated
 - 80 Whole House Retrofits
 - 65 Community Events
 - 2,600 Hours of Volunteer Time

- Category 2: Energy Efficiency measures; CFL switches, programmable thermostats, other verifiable retrofits
- Category 3: Community participation











Take Charge 2.0 Results


- 110 Billion BTUS of Energy Saved
