Call for Transportation Abstracts

Sensible deployment of technology-enabled travel options like ride-hailing, bike-sharing, and microtransit, as well as advanced vehicle technologies, will require a deep understanding of travel choices and behaviors. New, data-driven opportunities in freight movement and logistics can also either reduce or increase energy use and emissions, depending on businesses' behavior and decision making.
